

DMD Performance

- Overall 73% Familiar with DMD (Decrease of 5%)
- Grade the DMD
 - 76% gave DMD an "A" or "B" (Up 6%)
 - 18% gave DMD a "C" (Down 6%)
 - 4% gave DMD a "D" or "F" (Down 1%)
- Favored Expansion* of these DMD Services:
 - Advocacy (56%)
 - Economic Development Grants (58%)
 - *received 50%+ in favor of expansion



Overall Observations

- Lower level of participation but still strong.
 - Gender Flip, Slightly Older, Longer term residents
- Events continue to drive visitor traffic.
- Positivity towards Direction but less positivity towards Recent Activity (or lack thereof).
- Specific conditions of Downtown remain strong.
- Attitudes are a lot stronger levels of importance increased. Specific factors remained the same.
- DMD awareness remained steady/high and grade improved slightly.

Recovery Status

- 67% of Property Owners indicated that their properties are at 75% or great occupancy (LY 44%).
- Only 3% of employees work 100% remotely (LY 4%).
- 33% of Visitors have visited Downtown more than 12 times over the last year (LY 23%) with only 1% of Visitors having not returned to the Downtown in the last 12 months (LY 1%). 80% have visited at least 4 times (LY 83%).
