



A LETTER FROM OUR EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

DEAR FRIENDS.

It is my honor to share with you a recap of the Downtown Management District's accomplishments in 2024. Across many efforts, our Downtown witnessed a year of growth and activation. From work to keep our downtown clean, support events, and welcome visitors to celebrating new business investment and growing our local economy, our efforts are contributing to a stronger and more vibrant Downtown for El Pasoans and visitors to enjoy.

In 2024, Downtown El Paso experienced 11.2 million visits, matching our previous high from 2023 and a far cry from the low of 5.5 million visits during the pandemic year of 2020 (according to Placer.ai). The Downtown Welcome Ambassador program was expanded from seasonal to year-round to serve as a friendly face and resource for our guests. The framework for a Residential Conversion Utility Upgrade Grant Program was established to fulfill a strategic objective and spark residential investment. This program will take effect in 2025. In addition, property values, a key indicator of Downtown's redevelopment, increased by an impressive 16% for FY2024-2025. It's the highest year-to-year percentage growth in nearly 20 years.

The DMD also worked to share our story and engage the public with our businesses. Events like the Tasting Tour series and Downtown Employee Appreciation Day drew thousands of El Pasoans, and our social media presence continue to grow, with over 120,000 followers across various platforms and more than 10,000 subscribers to our weekly e-newsletter, the Downtown Insider.

We don't stand alone in our efforts and would not be as successful without the efforts of our many stakeholders and the interests of our community. Thank you to the DMD Board of Directors, Downtown stakeholders, and our community partners for helping us build a vibrant Downtown. Together, we're shaping a brighter future for El Paso.


GET TO KNOW THE DMD

The El Paso Downtown Management District (DMD) stands as a dynamic municipal entity dedicated to spearheading economic development initiatives, projects, programs, and services. Committed to cultivating a lively and inviting atmosphere, the DMD operates under the guidance of a 21-member Board of Directors made up of property owners, business tenants, and a resident. This board not only approves the annual budget but also offers strategic direction to fulfill the organization's principal mission to serve as a valuable and compelling driving force in facing the challenges and opportunities impacting Downtown El Paso.

The organization is funded in part by assessment revenue from properties within the district and supplemented through collaboration on specific projects and programs with the City, County, and other local organizations and individuals.

OUR DISTRICT

Downtown El Paso is vibrant and ever-evolving. Over time, distinct districts have emerged, each as unique and diverse as the people they attract. These five districts— El Centro, Union Plaza, Las Plazas, the Office District, and the Government District—are shaped not only by the activities they host but also by the people who frequent them. Commerce, culture, community, and historical influences have all played a role in defining the character of each district, collectively forming the heart of Downtown El Paso.






El Centro, the heart of Downtown El Paso, thrives as a vibrant shopping district blending history, culture, and commerce. Anchored by El Paso Street and stretching to the U.S.-Mexico border, it showcases open-air markets, multicultural influences, and over a century of architectural legacy. With landmarks like El Segundo Barrio and the Stanton Street Bridge, El Centro celebrates bi-cultural harmony through its food, retail, and rich heritage.





Union Plaza, distinguished by the historic El Paso Union Depot, has transformed from industrial roots into a mixed-use space. It houses restaurants like Chilabox and the Tiki Room, a candy shop nonprofits such as the Tom Lea Institute and Creative Kids, coworking spaces, the unique Boxstel hotel, lively entertainment venues, and the world-renowned Rocketbuster Boots.





Downtown El Paso's **Government District** is the center of democracy in action, hosting the Federal Courthouse, the El Paso County Courthouse, City Hall, and various City of El Paso and county buildings. Here, politics, policy, and justice unfold daily, reflecting the core functions of governance.











The Las Plazas Arts District, the cultural and recreational heart of Downtown El Paso, is home to iconic landmarks like San Jacinto Plaza, Pioneer Plaza, and the historic Plaza Theatre. San Jacinto Plaza, known as "La Plaza de los Lagartos," features a

sculpture honoring the alligators that once lived there. The Plaza Theatre, opened in 1930, was the first air-conditioned public theatre in the U.S. and underwent renovation in 2006. The district also includes Southwest University Park, the El Paso Museum of Art, the Convention Center, and the



Anson Mills Building, La Nube Stem Discovery Center, and the Mexican American Culture Center drawing visitors for art, entertainment, and community events.










The **Office District** thrives with daytime commerce and transitions to a lively social scene in the evening. Home to high-rise buildings housing employers, hotels and housing. It also features local gems like the nationally recognized Tap bar and restaurant, famous for its nachos, and the historic Gardner Hotel, operating since 1922 and hosting notable guests like John Dillinger. The district offers a blend of business activity and unique dining and nightlife experiences.



DOWNTOWN MANAGEMENT DISTRICT - OVERVIEW

The Downtown Management District (DMD) achieved significant progress in FY 2023-2024, focusing on engagement, advocacy, and activation to support stakeholders and attract visitors to Downtown El Paso.

Key Highlights:

- Visitor Growth: Downtown welcomed 11.3 million visits in 2023, a 6.6% increase over 2022, with 8.1 million visits recorded in the first nine months of 2024.
- Economic Impact: Property valuations grew by 16% for FY 2024-2025—the highest yearover-year increase in two decades.
- Strategic Initiatives: Expanded the yearround Ambassador Program, enhanced outreach, and developed a Residential Conversion Utility Upgrade Grant Program to support growth.
- Events & Engagement: Successful events like the Tasting Tour series and Downtown Employee Appreciation Day drew thousands of attendees.
- Social Media Growth: DMD's digital reach surpassed 120,000 followers across platforms, with over 10,000 Downtown Insider newsletter subscribers.





SANITATION PROGRAM: KEEPING DOWNTOWN EL PASO CLEAN

The El Paso Downtown Management District (DMD) spans 118 blocks, welcoming thousands of visitors daily. To maintain a clean and inviting environment, the DMD launched its Sanitation Program in 1997, working alongside the City of El Paso to supplement municipal services.

The DMD Sanitation Team ensures streets, sidewalks, and alleys remain clean, addressing issues like graffiti, litter, and illegal dumping.

Key Services:

- Litter and trash collection
- Illegal dumping cleanup
- Graffiti removal
- Sidewalk power-washing and gum removal
- Street light pole banner management

Through their dedication, the Sanitation Team helps make every visit to Downtown El Paso an enjoyable experience.









DOWNTOWN AMBASSADORS



The Downtown Ambassador Program is a hospitality initiative that the El Paso Downtown Management District first launched in 2016. Originally, it operated as a seasonal program, running from May to September for the summer season and from November to January during the WinterFest season. The program places friendly, knowledgeable, and easily identifiable ambassadors on the streets and in public spaces to greet, welcome, and assist visitors to Downtown El Paso.

After being on hiatus for two years, the Downtown Ambassador Program was relaunched in the Winter season of 2023 with three part-time employees. Since its relaunch, the program has transitioned from a seasonal initiative to a year-round operation, expanding to include up to five part-time employees. In October 2024, the program further grew with the addition of a Team Lead position to enhance operations and provide leadership support.

 Downtown employees who play a crucial role in

- **Downtown Fiesta Latina:** Created to reactivate the vibrant corner of Texas Avenue and Mesa Street, this event featured an evening filled with live music, dance competitions, food trucks, and vendor pop-ups showcasing local Downtown businesses. The Downtown Fiesta Latina brought the community together for a night of celebration, culture, and fun, further enriching the cultural fabric of the district.

DMD DEVELOPMENT

The Downtown Management District (DMD) continued to deliver outstanding services while preparing for future growth and opportunities during the fiscal year ending September 30, 2024. With a focus on engagement, advocacy, and activation, the DMD strengthened support for stakeholders, encouraged investment, and attracted visitors to Downtown El Paso.

According to Placer.ai, Downtown experienced 11.3 million visits in 2023, a 6.6% increase from the prior year, with 8.1 million visits recorded in the first nine months of 2024. Property valuations also saw a significant 16% year-over-year growth for FY 2024-2025, marking the highest increase in two decades. These milestones highlight the success of the DMD's ongoing efforts.

Key Highlights:

Visitor and Economic Growth

- 11.3 Million Visits in 2023: Downtown El Paso saw increased foot traffic, reflecting its growing appeal as a destination for business, dining, shopping, and events.
- 16% Property Valuation Growth: FY 2024-2025 marked the largest year-over-year increase in two decades, demonstrating investor confidence and redevelopment momentum.

Strategic Initiatives

- Year-Round Ambassador Program: The expansion of this program ensured ongoing support for stakeholders, visitors, and businesses while improving cleanliness and visitor experience.
- Residential Development Incentives: A new Residential Conversion Utility Upgrade
 Grant Program was developed to encourage residential growth in Downtown, with a
 planned launch in early 2025.
- Enhanced Stakeholder Outreach: Annual meetings with elected officials and datadriven decision-making strengthened DMD's role as a trusted advocate and resource.

Events and Activations

- Tasting Tour Series: These sold-out events showcased Downtown's diverse culinary scene and brought foot traffic to local restaurants.
- Downtown Employee Appreciation Day: In its fourth year, this event celebrated Downtown workers with giveaways, entertainment, and networking opportunities.
- Networking Events and Activations: New programs were introduced to foster connections and engagement among Downtown stakeholders.

DMD DEVELOPMENT

Advocacy and Project Support

- Public and Private Sector Projects: The DMD facilitated communication and coordination for projects like CBD IV roadway improvements, the Mexican American Cultural Center, La Nube, and private investments such as the Kress restoration.
- Film Production Support: The DMD played a key role in organizing and assisting with the filming of a major motion picture in Downtown El Paso.

Marketing and Communication

- Social Media Growth: The DMD's platforms saw tremendous growth, with over 120,000 followers across Facebook, Instagram, X (formerly Twitter), and TikTok.
- Downtown Insider Newsletter: Reaching over 10,000 subscribers, the newsletter served as a vital channel for promoting events, businesses, and initiatives.

Grant Programs

- Investments in Downtown: While no Commercial Facade Improvement Grants were issued, other grant programs supported investments in signage, lighting, murals, and pedestrian corridor improvements.
- Environmental Assessments: With support from an EPA grant, the DMD completed an inventory of Downtown properties to identify redevelopment opportunities and assist property owners.

Collaborative Leadership

- Board of Directors: The DMD Board remained active and engaged, achieving quorums at all 10 meetings and welcoming six new members in September 2023.
- Stakeholder and Sponsor Support: Generosity from stakeholders and sponsors generated nearly \$74,000 in support for DMD projects and initiatives.

The DMD is proud of these achievements and remains dedicated to fostering a vibrant and dynamic Downtown El Paso for businesses, residents, and visitors alike.
